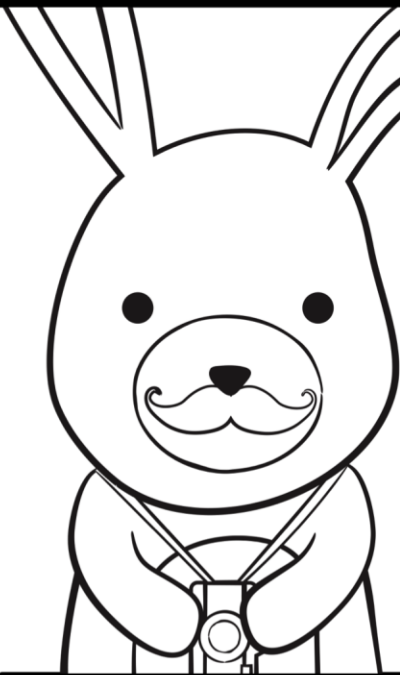


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ISD Virtual Spring Break Adventures

NEW READING PROGRAM: LEXIACORE5

The district was able to get a Lexia account for all my students. This is a NEW program that I've heard so many great things about! Your child does not have to start this, but I wanted to get this on your radar. The biggest thing I need you to remember is **PLEASE DO NOT HELP THEM WITH THE QUESTIONS.** This program is designed so that your child can be placed in the CORRECT LEVEL to support their learning. When your students log in for the first time, they will need to take the **PLACEMENT TEST.** This program builds up their skills *with phonics, phonological awareness, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension.* This program moves them up through the levels. Here's a breakdown:



- Level 1: Pre-K,
- Level 2-5: Kindergarten
- Level 6-9: 1st grade
- Levels 10-12: 2nd grade
- Levels 13-14 is 3rd grade
- Levels 15-16 is 4th grade
- Levels 17-18: 5th grade
