
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# MATH

## WRITING FOCUS



## SOCIAL STUDIES/SEL

<u>Social Studies/SEL</u>: We are learning how to ask assertively for help from an adult when he or she is stuck and doesn't know what to do. We talked about how we can feel frustrated or sad! We learned 3 steps:


- I. First, try really hard by myself to figure it out.
- 2. Then, ask another student for help.
- 3. If I still can't figure it out, ask a teacher or another adult.


